Our chapel urgently needs a new foundation to replace deteriorating wood pilings. An overall plan to preserve the chapel was



### **Ladies Bible Study**


Starting Thursday, June 15 at 10:00 am at Roe Baldwin's cottage, located on the corner of Mudge Ave & Thompson Ave.

Come and join in on these discussions for encouragement and enboldenment during these changing times.



# Memorial Day at Asbury Grove

May 30 was a beautiful day, though cool, and many persons came to the Grove for an outing, a number stopping over the Sabbath.B-D. Arms & Co. of Maplewood opened the store May 18 with a stock of groceries, also wood and coal. The Taylor Bros. intend to cater to the wants of their customers in all lines, and have distributed circulars to that effect, at the cottages on all the avenues in the Grove.

# A Walk Down Memory Lane

### **Cottage Owners**

\*Originally published between 1978-1982
The Asbury Grove Cottage Owners' Association was organized in 1926 as an aid to the corporation in improving the Grove. It is, however, mostly concerned with the psychological well-being of the people in the Grove.

The association meets twice a season, generally at the opening and the closing of the summer season. At these meetings cottage owners can air their opinions and can initiate measures to correct or improve any given problem.

The Cottage Owners' Association elects officers annually with the exception of the exception of the President and Vice-President. They are elected for two year terms. The association is open to all cottage owners. The dues are \$1.00 per family per season.

# The A.G. Boosters' Club

The Asbury Grove Boosters' Club began in 1953 when Reverend Willis P. Miller became chaplain at Asbury Grove. One of his first plans was to establish a five year program to boost and build the life of the Grove.

In August, 1953 an organization was formed which soon became known as the Asbury Grove Boosters' Club. Anyone could become a member by paying dues of \$1.00 a year.

Since its inception, the Boosters' Club has been responsible for the development of the recreational facilities. By the hands of the Asbury Grove men and some professional labor, an 80 by 45 foot olympic swimming pool, a wading pool, a bath house, and tennis and basketball courts were constructed.

At present the organization has 125 members and each year a letter is sent out to all its members notifying them of the Mid-Winter Reunion Banquet. At the banquet, plans are formulated for the summer season.

In 1971, the association was responsible for the establishment of a legal committee and the appointment of legal counsel.

However, all is not work for this association. The Cottage Owners' Association annually sponsors an old-fashioned lobster feast. Upwards of 200 lobsters are sold at these feasts as well as hot dogs, corn, pastry, and beverages.

The Cottage Owners' Association elects officers annually with the exception of the exception of the President and Vice-President. They are elected for two year terms. The association is open to all cottage owners. The dues are \$1.00 per family per season.
